FOREHEAD
"You can tell she had recent Botox from the tiny lines in the upper part of her forehead," Dr. Rivkin observes, noting how Sonja is wrinkle-free elsewhere. Cost: \$600 to \$800 every three to five months.

CHEEKS
Sonja has admitted to getting cheek injections, and Dr. Youn thinks she's using a filler like Voluma (\$2K). "I'm impressed with how subtly her cheeks have been filled," he says.

SKIN
Dr. Brandow praises Sonja for seemingly keeping out of the sun and says she's likely "done some peels on her face, neck and chest that make her skin look more youthful." Price per peel: \$1.5K.

LIPS
Without overdoing it, Sonja appears to have gotten "a bit of filler in her lips," Dr. Rivkin says. He suspects Juvéderm, which costs \$650 and lasts about eight months.
