injuries or illnesses.

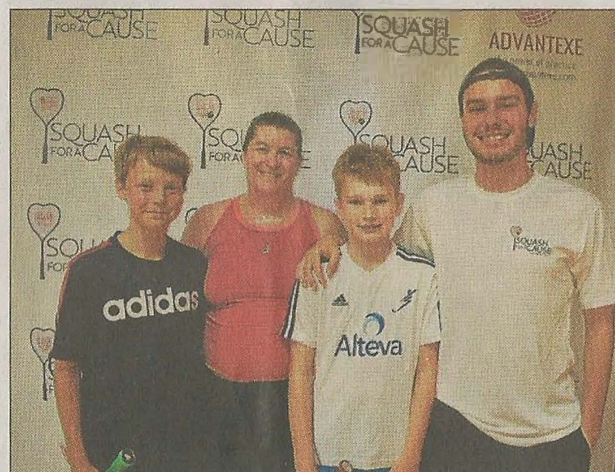
Squash For A Cause brought in over 100 attendees, including squash players, family, friends with the help of local community members Stephanie and Chase Brandow, orga-

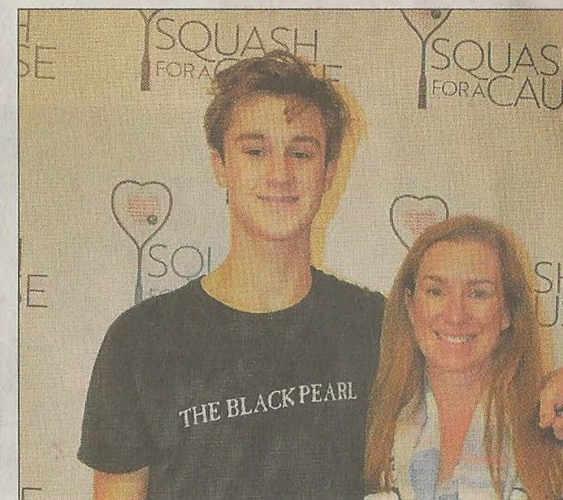
